## **Burlington County Office of Education**

The Burlington County Office of Education is a satellite office for the New Jersey Department of Education, Division of Regional Services, and is the liaison for Burlington County's 42 school districts to the Commissioner of Education.

The county office is responsible for a variety of areas, including certification of educators, periodic monitoring and evaluation of local school districts, review and approval processes for state and federal programs, and the annual review and approval of school districts' proposed budgets. The county office will also identify and refer to the Division of Student Services and/or Division of Finance any districts or schools that are not succeeding relative to the Core Curriculum Content Standards. The county office serves as the focal point of general oversight and routine communications between local school districts and the New Jersey Department of Education's central offices in Trenton.

Representatives from the county office will be available to respond to general educational inquiries from those seeking positions in Burlington County. Welcome to the Burlington County Institute of Technology. We are a public vocational technical school district, serving the academic and career and technical needs of students in grades 9 to 12 and those of adults through our Adult Education division. We have two campuses, one on Woodlane Road in Westampton, New Jersey and the other on Hawkins Road in Medford, New Jersey.

Our school district has been a part of Burlington County for more that 35 years and in that time has had only four superintendents. Many staff members have been with the district for 20 years or more. The demands of an ever-increasing enrollment have created these vacancies for certificated persons and aides. BCIT offers a comprehensive package of benefits (Heath Care, Prescription Plan, Dental Plan and Eye Care Plan) and a salary guide that is extremely competitive with other school districts in Burlington County, frequently ranking in the top five in the county as reported by the NJEA. In addition, there are ample opportunities for staff to gain supplemental income as coaches, activity advisors and to participate in summer work opportunities.

BCIT is a school district of choice and students come to us from all of the public, private and parochial schools of Burlington County. Our mission is to provide our students with a complete high school experience and the skills necessary for a fulfilled and productive work life.

BCIT observes a block-scheduling mode with the day divided into four 80 minute blocks. The academic year is semestered with two semesters in each year.

Each semester, students spend one or two blocks in their career major area and the remaining two in academic classes. Each campus offers a full complement of educational programs including English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, World Languages, Visual and Performing Arts, and Health and Physical Education. Honors courses are in place for a number of academic subjects. Students may also earn college credit for academic and career major courses. Students are required to pass the High School Proficiency Assessment in order to receive a state endorsed high school diploma.

In addition, BCIT competes as a member of the Burlington County Scholastic League. We field teams in baseball, basketball (Boys and Girls), bowling (Boys and Girls), cheerleading, cross country, field hockey, soccer (Boys and Girls), softball and wrestling.

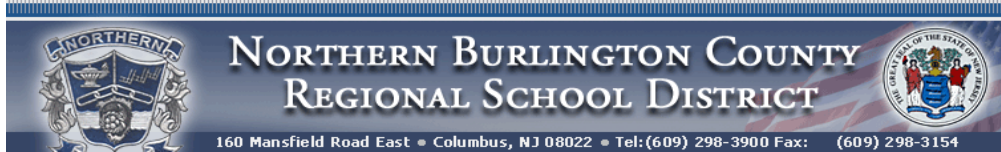
